



## **Lueck Announces 2018 Reelection Bid**

(Aitkin, MN – Jan. 31, 2018) Representative Dale Lueck announced he will seek reelection to a third term in the Minnesota House of Representatives, representing House District 10B.

Rep. Lueck said, “It is an exciting time for Aitkin and Crow wing County.” Lueck added, “We have made excellent progress in improving our local economy. I am especially proud that we finally reduced and in many cases completely eliminated the state income tax on senior’s social

security pension benefits. Our small businesses have been helped by a major reduction in the state general business tax. We put new money into roads and bridges, invested in the Cuyuna Country State Recreation Area and ensured that education and public safety were properly supported.”

Lueck represents House District 10B, which includes all of Aitkin County and a large portion of Crow Wing County. He serves as vice-chair of the House Mining, Forestry and Tourism Sub-Committee and is a member of the Agriculture Policy, Environmental Finance and Policy, Capital Investment and Veteran’s Affairs Committees. He also serves as chair of the Legislative Permanent School Fund Commission and is a member of the Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation Board.

“It is a privilege and honor to serve the citizens of Aitkin and Crow Wing County. With all state constitutional offices on the ballot in 2018, we will see a new governor elected. I want to be in legislature next year to work with the new governor, regardless of which party’s candidate is elected as our next governor.” Lueck said. “We have made substantial progress in creating opportunities here in rural Minnesota, but much more remains to be done.”

Dale and wife Linda have two grown children, five grandchildren and one great-grand child. Dale graduated from Aitkin Public High School in 1967. While serving in the US Navy he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Occupation Health & Safety and a Bachelor’s Degree in Business Administration. After 28 years of active duty service Dale retired from the US Navy in 1997. Dale and Linda currently raise beef cattle on their 340-acre farm in Aitkin County.
